El Dorado County Chamber opposes no growth initiatives Bad for jobs, property-owners' rights, and local control

The El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors unanimously voted to oppose four no growth ballot proposals heading for the November 2014 county ballot.

Why?

It's simple, these poorly conceived proposals are bad for jobs, erode property-owners' rights and will strip our county of local control over responsible planning and economic growth.

And they will not reduce traffic congestion and preserve open space as they claim. Instead they will make traffic worse and develop more open space and agricultural land by replacing planned communities that protect open space with hopscotch development spread over the county.

These initiatives are being pushed by a small group of environmental activists. They want to restrict property-owners' rights and control all decisions for land use in the county to advance their own agenda.

But their proposals are not only bad ideas, they are not nec-

El Dorado County's voter approved General Plan requires new development to be wellplanned, meet the character of our community by protecting natural resources and open space, and developers must pay to upgrade roads and other critical infrastructure. But removing these safeguards, will result in more sprawl, traffic, air pollution and the loss of agricultural land and open space.

And the initiatives would eliminate the fees developers currently pay to improve local roads to reduce traffic. If this change is approved, El Dorado County stands to lose millions of dollars to repair and upgrade roads, and instead may be forced to raise local taxes to make up for the loss of revenue.

These initiatives will strip us of the right to make local land use decisions. If these changes to the General Plan are approved, state bureaucrats, not local voters, would take control and have the

authority to approve development projects in our community.

Amending the General Plan would force residents, not developers, to bear the brunt of future road and highway improvements.

These initiatives are bad for our local economy — pushing jobs and employers to leave our area. By changing the county's General Plan, these initiatives would make it virtually impossible to attract new businesses to our area and prevent the economic investment needed to create jobs and grow our local economy.

These initiatives are deeply flawed and must be stopped. That's why the El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce will be joining a coalition that includes local farmers, classroom teachers, police and firefighters, doctors and nurses, local businesses, water experts and traffic experts to oppose changing El Dorado County's voter approved General

El Dorado Irrigation District Declares a Drought Stage 2 Water Warning **District Seeking 30% Water Use Reductions**

On February 4, 2014, EID's Board of Directors declared a Stage 2 Water Supply Warning due to the third straight year of extremely dry weather conditions that our region has experienced. Although the February storm provided some good precipitation – and did add to our snowpack and reservoir levels - the storm delivered only a small fraction of what is needed to make up the precipitation deficit.

The Stage 2 Water Supply Warning is still in effect for the entire EID service area until further notice. EID is asking their customers to continue to voluntarily reduce their water consumption and help them meet the overall District-wide goal of reducing water consumption by 30%. These voluntary actions will help the District avoid having to make more stringent declarations, such as making water reduction actions mandatory, imposing drought rates, and moving to a Stage 3 Water Crisis drought declaration and beyond. At its March 10 meeting, the EID Board will decide whether to convert the call for voluntary conservation into a mandate.

To get up-to-date news and information on the drought, EID encourages community members and customers to visit www. eid.org/drought and share this resource with their friends, family and neighbors. The drought web page includes links to practical water efficiency tips and other important information for customers. You may sign up on the EID webpage eNotifier link to receive automatic updates when drought-related news items are posted on the website.

EID also offers its customers various complimentary water savings devices such as low flow shower heads; kitchen and bathroom faucet aerators; toilet tank bags and dams (to displace water in older toilets); and toilet leak detection packets.

Complimentary water surveys are also available to help you learn about ways to conserve water inside and outside of your home. Just fill out and return the request form at www.eid. org/watersurvey by mail to EID Office of Water Efficiency, 2890 Mosquito Road, Placerville, CA 95667, or fax to 530-622-8569, or stop by the EID headquarters office Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and pick up these devices.
