Chamber endorses 'yes' on Measure C

El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce and El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce Political Action Committee Encourage a "YES" Vote on Measure C

The El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce and PAC voted to support Measure C, an El Dorado County Ballot Measure. Measure C will allow for the County to pay small vendors (contracts less than \$10,000) in a timely manner. Most

small vendors are our local businesses. This measure will allow the County to pay small vendors more efficiently. Currently, the County Charter requires a written contract any time a private party provides services regardless of the size or scope of the services. This makes sense for large contracts, but is wasteful and inefficient for small contracts. The measure will assure accountability through proper pur-

chase order and invoicing processes but eliminate the time and money consuming efforts currently required by small businesses to compete for contracts under 10,000.

Measure C is endorsed by Sheriff D'Agostini, District Attorney Vern Pierson, Supervisor John Knight and Auditor-Controller Joe Harn.
