Bears By Your Side receives mini-grant

Congratulations to Cruz Fregoso of Bears By Your Side, who was the recipient of a \$1000 mini-grant which was awarded at the recent Business Awards Luncheon and State of the County Address on May 18th.

Cruz formed Bears by Your Side after the Sandy Hook Shootings because he wanted to help children in Crisis. In 2021, he was able to incorporate and register as an official non-profit organization.

Bears By Your Side provides handmade teddy

bears to children in crisis. All of the handmade bears are made by volunteers with kits provided by Bears By Your Side. There are no paid employees. They have provided bears to organizations such as CASA, Big Brothers Big Sisters, New Morning Youth and Family services, Foster Family Services, the Upper Room, the siblings to the little girl killed by the drunk driver in Camino, Ronald McDonald House-Sacramento, Children of Afghani refuges . . . to name a few. In Cruz' application for the mini grant, he

wrote that the grant would be instrumental in purchasing an additional Cricut machine which is what is used to cut out the bear patters, material and supplies necessary to put together the kits volunteers use to make the bears.
